Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §12004-A. sub-§44, as amended by PL 2001, c. 166, \$1, is repealed. 4 Sec. 2. 32 MRSA c. 115, as amended, is repealed. 6 Sec. 3. 32 MRSA c. 115-A is enacted to read: 8 10 CHAPTER 115-A 12 PROFESSIONAL BOXING 14 §13521. General provisions The Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation 16 shall regulate professional boxing matches. For the purposes of 18 this chapter, "professional boxing matches" means boxing contests held between individuals for financial compensation but does not 20 include boxing contests regulated by an amateur sports organization. 22 §13522. Compliance with federal law 24 The Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation is the State's boxing commission for the purposes of the 26 Professional Boxing Safety Act of 1996, 15 United States Code, Sections 6301 to 6313 and shall ensure that safety standards. 28 registration procedures and other regulations required by federal 30 law are sufficient to protect the health and safety of boxers. The commissioner may contract with other states, other state 32 agencies or the Association of Boxing Commissions, or a successor organization recognized by the commissioner, in order to carry 34 out the purposes of this chapter. 36 §13523. Rulemaking; limitation 38 The Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation may adopt rules to carry out the purposes of the federal Professional Boxing Safety Act and this chapter. The 40 commissioner may not impose rules substantially more stringent than necessary to protect boxers' health and safety and to fully 42 comply with federal requirements. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 44 375, subchapter II-A. 46 SUMMARY 48 50 This bill repeals the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32,

chapter 115, which governs the Maine Athletic Commission and 2 establishes an alternative form of regulation under which the Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation acts as the State's boxing commission for the purposes of the federal 4 Professional Boxing Safety Act of 1996, 15 United States Code, Sections 6301 to 6313. This bill authorizes the commissioner to 6 contract with other states, other state agencies and the Association of Boxing Commissions, or its successor organization, 8 to carry out the purposes of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 115-A enacted this bill, including the chapter in 10 32, registration of professional boxers and the supervision of professional boxing events in this State. 12
