FISCAL NOTE

This legislation eliminates the commission established by the resolve and the corresponding General Fund appropriation. The additional costs associated with conducting a study of the issues involved in the design of a living memorial in Capitol Park dedicated to the victims and heroes of the September 11, 2001 tragedy can be absorbed by the State House and Capitol Park Commission utilizing existing budgeted resources.
