Resolve, Regarding Participation in Regional Transmission Organization.

Presented by Representative GOODWIN of Pembroke. Cosponsored by Representatives: BLISS of South Portland, HALL of Bristol. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, regional transmission systems are undergoing comprehensive restructuring that will have a significant and lasting impact upon competition in electricity markets and upon the costs faced by consumers of electricity in the State; and

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10 Whereas, important decisions regarding regional transmission systems are already being made in the context of substantive 12 litigation and negotiations; and

14 Whereas, the attention to and oversight of these proceedings by the Legislature and the Public Utilities Commission are vital 16 to protect the interest of the State's electric consumers; and

18 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 20 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 22 safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Study authorized. Resolved: That the Public Utilities Commission shall conduct a study to determine the feasibility of the State's transmission and distribution utilities' joining a regional transmission organization that includes northern Maine and portions of Canada. In conducting its study, the commission shall invite the participation of interested parties; and be it further

32 Sec. 2. Regional transmission organization governance. Resolved: That the Public Utilities Commission shall require that any 34 regional transmission organization joined by the State's transmission and distribution utilities have a governance 36 structure that provides for voting participation of consumers.

38 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

44 This resolve requires the Public Utilities Commission to conduct a study of the feasibility of the State's transmission 46 and distribution utilities' participation in a regional

transmission organization that includes northern Maine and
Canada. The resolve also requires that any regional transmission organization joined by the State's transmission and distribution
utilities have a governance structure that provides for meaningful consumer participation.
