The Legislature will require additional General Fund appropriations of \$2,730 and \$6,260 in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03, respectively, for the per diem and expenses of the legislative members of the Commission to Study County Jail Population, Cost and Reimbursement by the State and to print the required report.

26 The additional costs associated with providing staff assistance to the commission during the interim between 28 legislative sessions can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing existing budgeted resources. If an extension of the reporting 30 deadline is granted and the commission requires staffing assistance during the legislative session, the Legislature may 32 require an additional General Fund appropriation to contract for staff services.

The Department of Corrections will incur some minor 36 additional costs associated with the commission. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

42 This amendment replaces the membership of the commission with the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice. The 44 amendment expands the duties of the commission to study state subsidies that support county jails and community corrections 46 programs, alternative sentencing options and sentencing policies, and populations that are and are not being served by the county 48 jail system. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section and a fiscal note to the resolve.
