10 FISCAL NOTE

The additional costs associated with collecting certain data, developing a comprehensive strategy pertaining to the reduction of mercury emissions to the environment and submitting a required report to the Legislature can be absorbed by the Department of Environmental Protection utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

This is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources. The amendment replaces the bill, changes the title of the bill and makes the bill a resolve.

The amendment directs the Department of Environmental Protection to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources matters by January 1, 2003 on the product notification data received by the department by that date under the requirements of existing law. That report must also include recommendations on a comprehensive strategy to reduce the mercury content of products with the goal of maximizing the reduction of mercury emissions to the environment and any legislation necessary to implement those recommendations. The joint standing committee is given the authority to report out legislation to the First Regular Session of the 121st Legislature to implement recommendations included in this report.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note.

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
