24	Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection (a-1) in the first and 2nd lines by striking out the following: "and prior to placement"

28	Further amend the bill in section 1 in subsection (a-1) by striking out all of the next to last blocked paragraph (page 2,
30	lines 40 to 44 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following blocked paragraph: 'The court may waive the background check of a prospective adoptive parent if a previous background check was
32	completed under this subsection within a reasonable period of time and the court is satisfied that nothing new that would be
34	included in the background check has transpired since the last background check.

38	SUMMARY
40	This amendment eliminates the proposed requirement that a
42	prospective adoptive parent complete a background check prior to placement of the adoptee with that person.

amendment allows the Probate Court to waive subsequent background check, including the criminal history check based on fingerprinting, if a background check under this subsection on the same person was completed within a reasonable period of time and the Probate Court is satisfied that nothing new that would be included in the background check has transpired since the last check.
