Further amend the bill in section 6 in the first line (page 8 8, line 19 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "2003" the following: 'except that that section of this Act that repeals the 10 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, section 191, subsection 2, paragraph X takes effect January 1, 2004'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 14 summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

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This bill includes a General Fund deappropriation of \$56,312 20 in fiscal year 2002-03 and the elimination of 2 positions in the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of 22 Revenue Services to provide for the transfer of certain administrative responsibilities for the elderly low-cost drug 24 program to the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Family Independence effective January 1, 2003.

This bill includes a General Fund appropriation of \$56,312 28 in fiscal year 2002-03 and the establishment of 1 1/2 positions in the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Family 30 Independence to provide for the transfer of certain administrative responsibilities for the elderly low-cost drug program from the Department of Administrative and Financial 32 Services, Bureau of Revenue Services effective January 1, 2003.'

SUMMARY

38 This amendment amends the bill to retain a provision on eligibility for the elderly low-cost drug program that qualifies 40 a small number of people in a narrow category, provides for the delayed repeal of a provision on information sharing between the 42 Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Revenue Services and the Department of Human Services and changes 44 the position count from 3 persons to 1.5 full-time equivalents. It changes the appropriation correspondingly. It also adds a 46 fiscal note to the bill.
