- C. The board, at its discretion, may authorize use of funds
 in the reserve created pursuant to paragraph B to support
 the activities of the board.
- D. The board shall determine the assessments prior to May61st and shall assess each insurance company or association
and self-insured employer its pro rata share for8expenditures during the fiscal year beginning July 1st.
Each self-insured employer shall pay the assessment on or10before June 1st. Each insurance company or association
shall pay the assessment in accordance with subsection 3.

Sec. 2. Caribou hearing officer. Notwithstanding Private and Special Law 2001, chapter 24, a portion of the increased assessment on workers' compensation insurance established in that section of this Act that repeals and replaces the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 39-A, section 154, subsection 6 may be used to fund the administrative hearing officer position in the Caribou office of the Workers' Compensation Board.

Sec. 3. Transition. The Workers' Compensation Board shall use funds remaining in its reserve fund at the end of fiscal year 2001-02 to fund expenses as needed in fiscal year 2002-03. Any funds remaining in the reserve fund at the end of fiscal year 2002-03 are carried forward as the reserve fund in fiscal year 2003-04.

in fiscal year 2002-03 and reduces the limit on the reserve fund 2 created by over-collections from 25% to 10% of the board's budget. Increasing the assessment cap may result in increased dedicated revenues to the Workers' Compensation Board beginning 4 in fiscal year 2002-03. However, because the board intends to б utilize funds in the reserve account to fund the additional expenses of the board in fiscal year 2002-03, the board does not 8 anticipate collecting additional revenues through assessments for that fiscal year. The increased assessment cap will result in 10 increased dedicated revenues to the Workers' Compensation Board beginning in fiscal year 2003-04. The amount can not be determined at this time.' 12

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill. It increases the cap on assessment to fund the Workers' Compensation Board to 18 the \$8,300,000 beginning in fiscal year 2002-03. It reduces the limit on the reserve fund created by over-collections from 25% of 20 the board's budget to 10% of the board's budget and authorizes the board to use the reserve fund, at its discretion, to support 22 the activities of the board. The amendment also adds an appropriation and allocation section authorizing the board to 24 spend \$1,415,108 in fiscal year 2002-03 in addition to the funds allocated for fiscal year 2002-03 in a previously enacted budget 26 bill. The amendment directs the board to use its reserve account to fund the increased allocation for fiscal year 2002-03. It 28 also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
