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### 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1552, L.D. 2055

Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §336, sub-§1-A, as enacted by PL 1999, c. 716, §4, is amended to read:

- Records required by agricultural fairs. The treasurer 1-A. of the agricultural fair society conducting a game of chance that 8 is operated by a member of the agricultural fair society, or the treasurer's designee, shall keep a record as required by 10 An agricultural fair society that subsection 1. emplovs operators who are not members of the agricultural fair society 12 and that is-required chooses to use tokens as provided by section 14 341, subsection 3, shall keep a record of all tokens, tickets or other devices used to play games of chance, sold and redeemed for The records must include the exact amount of income from 16 cash. the sale of tokens, tickets or other devices used to play games of chance and the exact amount paid towards the redemption of the 18 tokens, tickets or other devices used to play games of chance, The records must include an exact account of expenses 20 for cash. and disposition of all other proceeds, including but not limited 22 to payments to any person, firm, corporation, association or organization for any purpose whatsoever. A11 records of 24 financial transactions involving games of chance must be separate and distinguishable from all other financial records of the 26 organization.
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- Sec. 2. 17 MRSA §336, sub-§2-A, as enacted by PL 1999, c. 716, §5, is amended to read:

Disposition of funds reports by agricultural fairs. 2-A. Agricultural fair societies licensed to conduct games of chance 32 that are operated by members of the agricultural fair society are subject to the disposition of funds reporting requirements 34 provided in subsection 2. Within 10 business days after the last day of any period during which games of chance are conducted by 36 an agricultural fair society that employs operators who are not 38 members of the agricultural fair society and that is--required chooses to use tokens as provided by section 341, subsection 3, the agricultural fair society shall file with the Chief of the 40 State Police a disposition of funds form prescribed and furnished 42 by the Chief of the State Police. The report must provide, in detail, the total number of tokens, tickets or other devices used to play games of chance sold and redeemed for cash and the 44 disposition of funds from the proceeds of the sale of tokens. Every statement must be made under oath by an officer of the 46 agricultural fair society or by the member of the agricultural 48 fair society in charge of the sale and redemption of tokens, tickets or other devices used to play games of chance.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1552, L.D. 2055

Sec. 3. 17 MRSA §341, sub-§3, as amended by PL 2001, c. 384, §1 and affected by §3, is further amended to read:

 Games conducted at agricultural fairs. Beginning January 1, 2002, games of chance conducted at agricultural fairs
may be conducted enly with tickets, tokens or other device approved by the Chief of the State Police by rule distributed by
the agricultural fair society.

10 Sec. 4. 17 MRSA §341, sub-§4, as amended by PL 2001, c. 384, §1 and affected by §3, is repealed.

Sec. 5. 17 MRSA §341, sub-§4-A is enacted to read:

4-A. Token denominations. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the tickets, tokens or other device approved by the Chief of the State Police must be unique to the agricultural society and may be in denominations of 25¢, 50¢ or \$1.

Sec. 6. Retroactivity. This Act applies retroactively to January 1, 2002.

24 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.'

### SUMMARY

30 This amendment strikes the original bill in its entirety and replaces it by amending current law to make the use of tickets or tokens for games of chance at agricultural fairs optional. This amendment is retroactive to January 1, 2002.
