Whereas, Great Northern Paper, Inc. has entered into an 2 agreement to sell its dams and hydroelectric and related

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facilities, with an anticipated closing in January 2002; and

Whereas, the sale of the dams and hydroelectric and related facilities will benefit the pulp and paper production and related facilities that are located in the towns of Millinocket and East Millinocket, and the Katahdin region will benefit from the operation of and capital investment, both present and future, in the dams and hydroelectric and related facilities; and

12 Whereas, the Legislature finds that the Katahdin region will benefit by an increase in the electric transmission line capacity 14 serving the region; and

16 Whereas, GNE, LLC intends to seek permits to invest approximately \$92,000,000 over 20 years to improve the dams and hydroelectric and related facilities and to seek permits expeditiously to invest approximately \$16,000,000 to increase to 130 megawatts the electric transmission line capacity connected to the dams and hydroelectric and related facilities and serving 22 the Katahdin region; and

Whereas, the sale of the dams and hydroelectric and related facilities will result in a capital gain to Great Northern Paper,
Inc., on which it will pay state income tax; and

28 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 30 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 32 safety; now, therefore,

#### 34 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Authority to transfer corporate rights. Great Northern 36 Paper, Inc. and its assigns, designees, transferees and any other successors to any of the rights, privileges, immunities or 38 franchises that have been granted by private and special law to Great Northern Paper, Inc. and its predecessors in interest, may, 40 in connection with the sale, mortgage or other conveyance of any interest in its dams and hydroelectric and related facilities, 42 referred to in this Act as "hydropower facilities," sell or transfer any such rights, privileges, immunities or franchises 44 related to the hydropower facilities and, notwithstanding any private and special law to the contrary, but subject to all other 46 applicable provisions of law, including, but not limited to, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, sell or transfer and transmit 48 electricity to any 3rd parties. Nothing in this paragraph may

construed to affect or limit any rights, privileges, be immunities or franchises granted by private and special law to or 2 obligations, conditions or limitations imposed upon Great Northern Paper, Inc. and its predecessors in interest with 4 respect to anything other than the hydropower facilities.

In connection with the closing of the sale of the hydropower facilities by Great Northern Paper, Inc., Great Northern Paper, 8 Inc. shall enter into an agreement allowing Great Northern Paper, 10 Inc. to purchase for a 10-year period, with an option to purchase for another 5 years, an amount of electricity that is not less 12 than the amount of electricity generated by the hydropower facilities. If such an agreement is not entered into, Great Northern Paper, Inc. may not sell or transfer, pursuant to the 14 authority granted under this section, any of the rights, privileges, immunities or franchises that have been granted by 16 private and special law to Great Northern Paper, Inc. and its 18 predecessors in interest and may not, pursuant to the authority section, sell, transfer granted under this or transmit 20 electricity to any 3rd party.

22 The holder of any license issued under Part I of the Federal Power Act, 18 United States Code, Sections 791a - 825r, for the Hydropower Facilities shall provide to the Governor and the 24 Legislators representing the districts located within the 26 counties of Penobscot, Piscataquis and Aroostook written notice of any of the following events sent by certified mail, and shall provide the notified persons with an opportunity to meet and 28 discuss any resulting impacts to the Katahdin region, in any of 30 the following circumstances: prior to the filing of any application to transfer any such license; prior to the filing of any notification required by the Hart-Scott-Rodino Antitrust 32 Improvements Act of 1976, 15 United States Code, Section 18a with 34 respect to the Hydropower Facilities; and no later than 10 days after the cessation of all paper production at either the paper production facility in Millinocket or the paper production 36 facility in East Millinocket for a period of at least 90 days, 38 referred to in this Act as a "Paper Mill Closing." If the holder of any such license fails to comply with the requirements of this paragraph, the holder of the license may not sell or transfer, 40 pursuant to the authority granted under this Act, any of the rights, privileges, immunities or franchises that have been 42 granted by private and special law to Great Northern Paper, Inc. and its predecessors in interest and may not, pursuant to the 44 authority granted under this Act, sell, transfer or transmit electricity to any 3rd party. 46

The authorizations granted and the obligations, conditions 48 and limitations imposed under this Act are pursuant and subject 50 to the State's ownership of the waters of the State.

Sec. 2. Conditions and limitations. Within the period beginning 2 at commencement of operation of increased electric transmission line capacity serving the Katahdin region and ending 15 years 4 after the transfer to GNE, LLC of the Hydropower Facilities, if 6 there is a Paper Mill Closing the owner of the Hydropower Facilities shall pay an annual amount of \$75,000 to the economic 8 development body serving the Katahdin region, as identified by the Department of Economic and Community Development, for each 10 Paper Mill Closing. Payments cease upon the resumption of paper production at the affected mill. For purposes of this section, "increased electric transmission line capacity serving the 12 Katahdin region" means any electric transmission lines that will allow the continuous transmission of electricity generated by the 14 Hydropower Facilities to or from any consumer other than the paper production facility in Millinocket or the paper production 16 facility in East Millinocket and having a capacity to transmit in 18 excess of 70 megawatts.

20 The owner of the Hydropower Facilities and the owner of the paper production facility in Millinocket or the paper production facility in East Millinocket may not enter into any agreement or 22 understanding with each other under which the owner of the paper 24 production facility in Millinocket or the paper production facility in East Millinocket receives revenue from the sale of electricity from the Hydropower Facilities and there is a Paper 26 Mill Closing for the purpose of allowing or increasing the sale 28 of the electricity from the Hydropower Facilities to any other purchaser or entity or into the wholesale electric market. If 30 the owner of the paper production facility in Millinocket or the paper production facility in East Millinocket enters into such an 32 agreement or understanding, the owner of the paper production facility shall pay to the Treasurer of State, upon the Paper Mill Closing, an amount equal to the value of all tax credits or 34 reimbursements relating to property associated with that paper production facility received by the owner pursuant to the Maine 36 Revised Statutes, Title 36, chapter 915 after the effective date of this Act. If the owner of the Hydropower Facilities enters 38 into such an agreement or understanding, the owner of the Hydropower Facilities may not sell or transfer, pursuant to the 40 authority granted under section 1 of this Act, any of the rights, privileges, immunities or franchises that have been granted by 42 private and special law to Great Northern Paper, Inc. and its predecessors in interest and may not sell, transfer or transmit, 44 pursuant to the authority granted under section 1 of this Act, 46 electricity to any 3rd party.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 2 preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.' 4 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 6 concept draft summary the following: 8 **'FISCAL NOTE** 10 Transferring the charter rights to facilitate the sale of a certain hydroelectric facility may increase current or future 12 General Fund revenue if a capital gain is realized depending on the seller's current or future corporate income tax position. 14 Whether any such revenue might be in excess of budgeted estimates can not be determined at this time. 16 The additional costs associated with identifying economic 18 development bodies serving the Katahdin region can be absorbed by 20 the Department of Economic and Community Development utilizing existing budgeted resources.' 22 24 **SUMMARY** 26 This amendment, which is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities and Energy, facilitates the pending sale of Great Northern Paper, Inc.'s Hydroelectric 28 Facilities by allowing Great Northern Paper, Inc. and its successors to transfer to 3rd parties any or all charter rights 30 related to Great Northern Paper, Inc.'s Hydroelectric Facilities, 32 and confirms Great Northern Paper, Inc.'s authority to sell power on the same basis as any other person engaged in the business of selling electricity and to clarify that the purchaser of Great 34 Inc.'s dams and hydroelectric and related Northern Paper, facilities will have that ability. The amendment also requires 36 notification and an opportunity to meet with the Governor and area Legislators, upon the occurrence of certain events that 38 would affect the Katahdin region. 40 The amendment requires certain payments to be made to the 42 economic development body serving the Katahdin region if, during a defined 15-year period, certain new transmission lines are 44 built and there is a Paper Mill Closing. The amendment prohibits any agreement or understanding between the owner of the 46 Hydropower Facilities and the owner of either paper mill under which the owner of a mill receives revenue from the sale of electricity from the Hydropower Facilities and there is a paper 48 mill closing for the purpose of allowing or increasing the sale

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of the electricity from the Hydropower Facilities to any other purchaser or entity or into the wholesale electric market.

The amendment repeals certain obsolete provisions of Private
 and Special Law relating to authorizations for certain entities
 to sell power or transmit energy from the Hydropower Facilities.
