' "Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to permit a tax rate to be applied to the just value of secondary residential property that is different from that applied to the just value of other property for the purpose of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 and to require that allocations from a reserve fund that sets aside funds for such a purpose receive an affirmative vote of 2/3 of the Legislature?" '

SUMMARY

The resolution, as amended by Committee Amendment "A," proposed to permit the Legislature to establish different maximum property tax rates for different classes of property for the purpose of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12. This amendment instead proposes to specify that the Legislature may permit a different tax rate to be applied to the just value of secondary residential property than is applied to the just value of all other classes of property for the purpose of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12. This amendment also proposes to require that allocations from a reserve fund that sets aside funds for such a purpose receive an affirmative vote of 2/3 of the members of the Legislature.
