24	Amend the resolution by striking out the title and
26	substituting the following:

30	Purposes of Property Taxes to Fund Public Education'
32	Further amend the resolution by striking that part relating to Article IX, section 8, subsections 1-A and 1-B (page 1, lines
34	13 to 42 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:
36	'Constitution, Art. IX, §8, sub-§6 is enacted to read:
38	<u>6. Property taxes for education funding. The Legislature may establish classes of property and permit a different tax rate</u>
40	for each class of property for the portion of the property tax that is assessed for the purpose of funding public education from
42	kindergarten to grade 12 as defined by the Legislature. The Legislature shall establish the procedure to determine the tax
44	rate for each class of property established under this subsection.'
46	Further amend the resolution by striking out all of the
48	question (page 2, lines 6 to 11 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1582, L.D. 2087

' "Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to permit the Legislature to establish different maximum property tax rates for different classes of property for the purpose of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12?" '

Further amend the resolution by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

The estimated cost of sending this proposed constitutional amendment out to referendum will vary according to the total number of referenda enacted during the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature to be submitted to the voters in November. The estimated cost to the Secretary of State if one to 6 referenda are enacted is \$121,392. Each additional referendum costs an additional \$8,000.

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This constitutional resolution is part of a proposal by the 22 Education Funding Reform Committee and is accompanied by separate legislation that would reduce the State's reliance on the 24 property tax to fund public education. If enacted, this constitutional resolution would permit the Legislature to make 26 changes to local property tax rates for the purpose of funding 26 the cost of local education from kindergarten to grade 12.

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The fiscal impact of this constitutional resolution on the 30 Department of Education, local school units and state tax revenue and administrative expenses of the Department of Administrative 32 and Financial Services, Bureau of Revenue Services can not be determined at this time. The resolution would have no fiscal 34 impact to the Legislature.

36 If approved by the voters, it is unknown what changes the Legislature would make regarding funding the cost of local 38 education; therefore, the cost of such changes can not be determined at this time.'

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SUMMARY

44 This amendment removes provisions from the original resolution proposing to exempt personal property from the 46 property tax if an excise tax was established for that property and clarifies the language authorizing the Legislature to 48 establish classes of property and to permit different tax rates

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for different classes of property for the purpose of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12. The amendment also amends the question and adds a fiscal note.
