Sec. F-1. 34-A MRSA §1402, sub-§5, as amended by PL 1991, c. 314, §19, is further amended to read:

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5. Grievance procedures. The commissioner shall establish procedures for hearing grievances of clients as described in section 1203. The commissioner, in consultation with the Department of Behavioral and Developmental Services, shall establish a separate grievance process for addressing complaints by clients with mental illness about their treatment, which must include a means by which a client may obtain a 2nd opinion about mental health treatment from an independent mental health professional.
