An Act to Implement the Recommendations of the Blue Ribbon Commission on Postsecondary Educational Attainment.

18	<u>§10401. Maine Higher Educational Attainment Council established</u>
20	The Maine Higher Educational Attainment Council, referred to in this chapter as the "council," is established to provide a permanent voice in support of higher education, to create a
22	statewide vision for higher educational attainment and to develop, maintain and evaluate implementation of a long-term plan
24	for higher educational attainment in the State.
26	<b>1. Membership.</b> The council consists of 16 members. The Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the
28	House of Representatives shall jointly appoint the following 16 members, 2 of whom must be designated to serve as cochairs of the
30	council:
32	A. Twelve members collectively having a broad range of interests, including, but not limited to, higher education,
34	kindergarten to grade 12 education, business and labor; and
36	<u>B. Four members of the Legislature with a demonstrated</u> interest in higher education.
38	One member of the council must be a member of a statewide
40	association of independent colleges.
42	2. Appointments. Members appointed to the council serve 3-year terms except the terms of the initially appointed members
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48	3. Ouorum. Nine members of the council constitute a guorum.

	4. Compensation. Members of the council are not entitled
2	to compensation for their services, except for those members of
	the Legislature appointed to the council, who receive the
4	legislative per diem.
б	§10402. Powers and duties
8	1. Develop long-term plan for increasing level of educational attainment in State. The council shall:
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12	A. Develop and recommend a long-term plan, goals, benchmarks and alternative strategies for increasing the level of educational attainment in the State;
14	B. Monitor progress in accomplishing the long-term plan's
16	vision, goals and benchmarks;
18	C. Develop a recommended plan of action to implement the recommendations of the Blue Ribbon Commission on
20	<u>Postsecondary Educational Attainment established pursuant to</u> Resolve 2001, chapter 66; and
22	D. Recommend changes in the long-term plan to reflect newly
24	identified education needs within the State.
26	2. Council procedures. The council shall use the following guidelines when developing the long-term plan described in
28	subsection 1.
30	A. The process must be continuous, with a multiyear planning horizon. It must include clear authority for
32	monitoring and evaluating progress in evaluating the long-term plan on a regular basis.
34	B. The long-term plan must have a strategic focus and
36	measurable outcomes, with clear goal-setting and performance indicators.
38	C. The council may appoint working groups and advisory
40	committees as necessary, representing key concerned parties, to accomplish the goals outlined in this section.
42	D. The process must be statewide in scope, using available
44	technology to ensure that all areas of the State have access to the work of the council.
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48	E. Preparation and maintenance of the long-term plan must be through a public and private partnership approach that is objective and nonpartisan.
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3. Long-term plan contents. The long-term plan developed by the council under this section must consist of:

- A. A process for improving educational attainment within the State that demonstrates a shared commitment to achieving
   that end and a recognition that new forms of cooperation among public and private institutions of higher education, kindergarten to grade 12 education, State Government and the wider community at large are required to achieve the plan's goals;
- 12B. A strategy for implementing the recommendations of the<br/>Blue Ribbon Commission on Postsecondary Educational14Attainment established pursuant to Resolve 2001, chapter 66;
- 16 <u>C. Benchmarks for accomplishing the long-term plan that are specific and quantifiable performance indicators against</u>
  18 which each of the goals that have been set forth to accomplish the vision can be measured;
- D.Alternative strategies to accomplish the benchmarks22based upon the best practices in this State, other states<br/>and other countries; and

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E. A strategy for improving educational attainment that is not limited to traditional baccalaureate programs. The long-term plan must include consideration of improving the academic and career preparation of all kindergarten to grade 12 students, increasing workforce training and retraining programs, removing financial and other barriers to educational attainment and increasing the capacity of all types of postsecondary educational programs to meet the educational needs of citizens of this State.

4. Fiscal matters. The responsibility for funding the
 36 council must be shared equally between government and the private
 38 sector. The Maine Development Foundation shall serve as the
 38 council's fiscal agent, providing regular financial reports to
 the council on funds received and expended and an annual audit.
 40 The Maine Development Foundation shall seek funds and accept
 gifts to support the council's objectives.

### 5. Staff support. The Maine Development Foundation shall provide staff support to fulfill the requirements of this section.

 6. Report. Beginning in January 2003, the council shall report annually to the Legislature and the joint standing
 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters. The council shall report on implementation of its
 long-term plan and recommended changes to the long-term plan.  Sec. 3. Initial members. The initial members of the Maine Higher Educational Attainment Council established in the Maine
 Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 10401 must be appointed by September 1, 2002.

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#### **SUMMARY**

10 This bill is reported by the Blue Ribbon Commission on Postsecondary Educational Attainment pursuant to Resolve 2001, chapter 66, section 8. The bill establishes the Maine Higher 12 Educational Attainment Council to develop a long-term plan for increasing the level of educational attainment in the State and 14 to provide a unified voice for higher education in the State. 16 The council is a 16-member body appointed jointly by the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House. The council is to be equally funded by government and the 18 private sector. It will report to the Legislature and the joint 20 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters annually. 22
