The departments shall work with interested parties to identify processes that will ensure that information about endangered and threatened species can be disseminated in a timely manner to affected parties. The departments shall report their findings and any proposed legislation to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters by January 2, 2003.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Conservation and the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife will incur some minor additional costs to submit a required report to the Legislature. These costs can be absorbed within the departments' existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve and requires the Department of Conservation and the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to evaluate the current systems of communication between the departments and with private landowners and foresters regarding the location of endangered and threatened species on private property. The departments are required to report their findings and any proposed legislation to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife by January 2, 2003. It also adds a fiscal note.

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
