6	Copyright or licensing restrictions may not be fixed by the geographic information board or data custodians to the
8	information made available through the Maine Public Library of Geographic Information. The geographic information board may set
10	fees for electronic copies of library data that are no more than 3 times the actual cost of reproduction. Fee schedules must be
12	set annually and made readily available to requestors.
