	This amendment is the report of the Committee of
22	Conference. This amendment amends the bill to remove those provisions that authorize the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and
24	Lottery Operations to continue to operate the remaining 19 state liquor stores and require the bureau to annually report to the
26	Legislature on the operation of those 19 state liquor stores. This amendment also includes that provision proposed in Committee
28	Amendment "A" that provides that, if a licensee dies, the licensee's surviving spouse or designated heir must be issued the

license if the spouse or heir requests it.

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
