12 The requirement that each school unit add varicella vaccine to the required vaccines for school enrollment and adopt a uniform permanent student health record that provides 14 documentation of health information and school nursing services 16 provided to individual students including, but not limited to, immunizations, health screening, health assessment and nursing care plans as needed, represents a state mandate pursuant to the 18 Constitution of Maine. The additional local costs can not be 20 determined but are anticipated by the Department of Education to be minor. Unless General Fund appropriations are provided to 22 fund at least 90% of the additional costs or a Mandate Preamble is amended to the bill and 2/3 of the members of each House vote to exempt this mandate from the funding requirement, the local 24 school units may not be required to implement these changes.

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implementation The of certain rules pertaining to immunization requirements for children will result in minor 28 additional costs to the Department of Education. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources. 30

32 The Bureau of Health in the Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional costs to implement the rules pertaining to immunization requirements for children. These 34 costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted 36 resources.'

38 **SUMMARY** 40 This amendment requires specific changes to the rules that were provisionally adopted by the Department of Human Services and the Department of Education, and adds a fiscal note to the 42 resolve. 44
