SUMMARY

This bill allows the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to authorize a private landowner owning a continuous piece of property that is greater than 500 acres and located entirely within unorganized territory to open that property to hunters licensed to hunt on Sunday. The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife may issue Sunday hunting permits to hunt rabbit and grouse during the regular open season on authorized private property. The commissioner may not authorize private property for Sunday hunting if that property adjoins certain public property. The fee for a Sunday hunting permit is \$15.
