Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4       **Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §285-A, sub-§2**, as amended by PL 1997, c. 77,  
§1, is further amended to read:

6       **2. Membership.** The State Employee Health Commission  
consists of 20 labor and management members as follows:

10       A. One labor member from each bargaining unit recognized  
under Title 26, chapter 9-B, appointed by the employee  
organization certified to represent the unit;

14       B. One labor member from the largest bargaining unit  
recognized under Title 26, chapter 14, appointed by the  
employee organization authorized to represent the unit;

16  
18       C. One labor member appointed by the retiree chapters of  
the Maine State Employees Association;

20       C-1. One labor member from Maine Turnpike Authority  
employees appointed by the employee organization authorized  
22 to represent the employees;

24       C-2. One labor member from Maine State Retirement System  
employees, appointed by the employee organization authorized  
26 to represent the employees;

28       D. Four management members appointed by the Commissioner of  
Administrative and Financial Services;

30       E. One management member appointed by the Court  
32 Administrators;

34       F. The Executive Director of Health Insurance, ex officio;

36       G. One member representing retirees appointed by the Maine  
Association of Retirees;

38       H. One labor member from the Maine Technical College System  
40 faculty or administrative unit, appointed by the employee  
organization authorized to represent the units;

42       I. One management member from the Maine Technical College  
44 System appointed by the President of the Maine Technical  
College System; and

46       J. One management member appointed by the Executive  
48 Director of the Maine Turnpike Authority.

2 All appointed or elected members serve at the pleasure of their  
4 appointing or electing authorities.
