28	'FISCAL NOTE
30	This bill will avoid an unbudgeted increase in costs to state agencies through increased workers' compensation payments
32	and premiums beginning in fiscal year 2002-03. The total savings to state agencies can not be determined at this time but is
34	estimated to be approximately \$7,600,000.
36	Based on an analysis by the National Council of Compensation
38	Insurance, workers' compensation insurance rates in Maine will increase by 15% or more if this bill is not enacted. A 15% increase in the State's workers' compensation rate would increase
40	costs to state agencies by approximately \$1,600,000 beginning in fiscal year 2002-03. Passage of this bill will prevent that
42	increase.
44	The National Council of Compensation Insurance also estimates a significant cost to Maine's employers of applying the
46	Court's ruling retroactively. The cost to the State as a result

of the retroactive application is estimated to be approximately

\$6,000,000. This bill will prevent that increase as well.'
