and expenses of the Committee to Study the Membership and Practices of the Emergency Medical Services' Board.

The additional costs associated with providing staffing assistance to the committee during the interim between legislative sessions can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing existing budgeted resources. If an extension of the reporting deadline is granted and the committee requires staffing assistance during the legislative session, the Legislature may require an additional General Fund appropriation to contract for staff services.'

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14 SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the committee bill and is the minority report. The amendment is a resolve that creates the Committee to Study the Membership and Practices of the Emergency Medical Services' Board. The committee is comprised of the members of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice. committee shall: review the composition of the Emergency Medical Services' Board to determine if that board's membership provides a fair and balanced representation to the State; review the practices of the Emergency Medical Services' Board; and review communication and support provided by the Emergency Medical Services' Board to emergency medical services providers and consumers. The committee shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Legislature no later than November 6, 2002. The committee is authorized to introduce legislation related to its report to the First Regular Session of the 121st Legislature. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section and a fiscal note to the bill.
