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SUMMARY

This amendment removes the emergency status of the bill and 6 makes corrections to the amendment to reflect the motions made to accept the majority report.

This amendment clarifies that Part GG does not repeal but 10 suspends operation of the law that allows nonprofit nursing facilities to be reimbursed for a return on net assets and that 12 Part HH does not repeal but delays operation of the law that lowered the minimum occupancy percentages for nursing facilities.
