Whereas, for over 10 years, Seeds of Peace 2 International Camp located in Otisfield has been bringing teenagers from regions in conflict around the world to learn about conflict resolution and the art of peacemaking; and 4 6 Whereas, Seeds of Peace International Camp has received worldwide recognition as an effective model for resolving international conflict, including a UNESCO Peace Prize from the 8 United Nations and the International First Freedom Award from the Council for America's First Freedom; and 10 12 Whereas, Maine is the home of many honored peacemakers, including Samantha Smith and George Mitchell; and 14 Whereas, Seeds of Peace International Camp has received support 16 from numerous Maine businesses and educational institutions; and 18 Whereas, it is appropriate and fitting that the State, as the home of peacemakers, should demonstrate its support of the 20 unique efforts of Seeds of Peace International Camp; now, 22 therefore, be it 24 Sec. 1.
