including counseling and treatment through the toll-free tobacco help line. The rules must contain procedures for revoking the license of a foster home where smoking is taking place in the home or in the foster parent's private vehicle while a foster child is in that vehicle. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are major substantive rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 2 10 (page 1, lines 17 to 24 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 2. Reporting. The Department of Human Services shall
report to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services by January 1, 2004 regarding the number of foster
parents in licensed foster homes who smoke tobacco and the number who are interested in assistance in overcoming their addiction to
tobacco.'

## **SUMMARY**

This amendment is the majority report of the committee. The 24 amendment restricts the prohibition on smoking in a foster parent's vehicle that is contained in the bill to smoking while a foster child is in the vehicle. 26 The amendment provides for phasing in the prohibition on foster parents smoking in their 28 homes and in their vehicles while a foster child is in the vehicle and provides for state assistance on smoking addiction. The amendment requires rulemaking and designates the rules as 30 major substantive rules. The amendment requires reporting from the Department of Human Services regarding the number of foster 32 parents who smoke and the number who are interested in assistance 34 in overcoming their addiction to tobacco.
