An Act Regarding the Enforcement Powers of the Office of the State Fire Marshal

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2396, sub-§7, as amended by PL 1997, c. 728, §20, is further amended to read:

Other duties. The performance of such other duties as are set forth in this and other sections of the statutes and as may be conferred or imposed from time to time by law. The State Fire Marshal, the State Fire Marshal's deputy and investigators appointed under this Title shall carry out those functions that the Commissioner of Public Safety may direct and in so doing have the same enforcement powers and duties throughout the State as sheriffs have in their respective counties. The--enforcement powers-are-to-be-limited-in-scope-to-enforcement-of-statutes, erdinances --and-rules--concerned-with-fire-prevention, --arson-and other-burnings-and-enforcement-of-such-other-specific-areas-of responsibility-as-are-assigned-to-the-Office-of-the-State-Fire Marshal--by--statuter--and--te--arrest--fer--impersonation--ef--er interference -- with, -- the -- State - Fire - Marshal, -- the -- State -- Fire Marshal's-deputy-or-their-designees+

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SUMMARY

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Under current law, the State Fire Marshal and the State Fire Marshal's deputy and investigators are granted the same enforcement power and duties as sheriffs have in their respective counties, except that those powers are limited to enforcement of laws, rules and ordinances concerned with issues such as fire prevention and arson. This bill removes this limitation.
