COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. to Increase the Minimum Ring Size of L		ill, "An Act

22 Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following: 24

'An Act To Set the Minimum Legal Shell Size for Scallops'

Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the 28 enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6728, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 2001, c. 192, 32 §1, is repealed.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6729 is enacted to read: 34

36 §6729. Shell size minimum

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38 1. Minimum shell size. Except as provided in subsection 4, this subsection governs the shell size limits of scallops. 40 A. From December 1, 2003 to November 30, 2004, a person may 42 not possess, ship, transport, buy or sell scallops that are less than 3 3/4 inches in the longest diameter. 44 B. On December 1, 2004 and thereafter, a person may not 46 possess, ship, transport, buy or sell scallops that are less than 4 inches in the longest diameter. 48

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "" to H.P. 90, L.D. 81

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2. Prima facie evidence. It is prima facie evidence of possession of illegal scallops if a vessel contains scallops less 2 than the minimum shell size set by this section or the minimum shell size set by rules adopted pursuant to this section while a 4 scallop boat license holder or crew member is shucking scallops. б 3. Release of undersize scallops. Those scallops that are 8 less than the minimum shell size established by this section or by rules adopted pursuant to this section must be immediately liberated into the waters from which they were taken. 10 4. Rules. After December 1, 2004, the commissioner may 12 adopt rules to increase the minimum shell size set by this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine 14 technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 16 <u>2-A.</u> 18 5. Violation. A person who violates this section commits a civil violation. The following penalties apply. 20 A. For the first offense, a fine of \$250 is imposed and all 22 scallops on board may be seized. 24 B. For the 2nd and each subsequent offense, a fine of \$250 is imposed, all scallops on board may be seized and the scallop boat license may be suspended for one year.' 26 28 SUMMARY 30 This amendment replaces the bill and changes the title. Beginning on December 1, 2003, the amendment sets a statewide 32 minimum shell size for scallops of 3 3/4 inches, and on December 1, 2004 it increases that minimum size to 4 inches. The 34 amendment requires the immediate release of all scallops that do not meet the size requirements and provides for prima facie 36 evidence of the possession of illegal scallops. It also provides the Commissioner of the Department of Marine Resources with the 38 authority to increase the shell size minimum and makes violations of shell size restrictions civil violations. 40 42 FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED 44
