2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
4	as emergencies; and
	Whereas, the state committee of a political party must file
6	certification with the Secretary of State by December 1st of the
	year prior to a presidential election if it is determined that a
8	presidential primary election will be held; and
10	Whereas, this legislation must take effect before the
	expiration of the 90-day period in order to be in place to avoid
12	the expense of the preparation of the notification by the state committee; and

	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
16	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
	Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
18	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
