(1) Emergency lights used on an ambulance, an
emergency medical service vehicle, a fire department vehicle, a fire vehicle or a hazardous material
response vehicle must emit a red light or a combination of red and white light.

(2) The municipal officers or a municipal official 8 designated by the municipal officers, with the approval of the fire chief, may authorize an active member of a municipal or volunteer fire department to use a 10 flashing red signal light not more than 5 inches in 12 diameter on a vehicle. The light may be displayed but may be used only while the member is en route to or at the scene of a fire or other emergency. The light must 14 mounted as near practicable above the be as registration plate on the front of the vehicle or on 16 the dashboard. A light mounted on the dashboard must be shielded so that the emitted light does not 18 interfere with the operator's vision.

(3) Members of an emergency medical service licensed
 by Maine Emergency Medical Services may display and use
 on a vehicle a flashing red signal light of the same
 proportion, in the same location and under the same
 conditions as those permitted municipal and volunteer
 firefighters, when authorized by the chief official of
 the emergency medical service.

 10. Use of lights; requirements; revocation. Active
 32 members of a municipal or volunteer fire department must meet the following requirements prior to exercising the privilege of using
 34 flashing red lights on personal vehicles:

- 36 A. Be at least 21 years of age;
- 38 <u>B. Have completed 3 years of active service in a municipal</u> or volunteer fire department; and

- C.Have completed a state-certified emergency vehicle42operators course.
- 44 The privilege of using a light may be revoked at any time for misconduct by a municipal officer or a municipal official 46 designated by the municipal officers, with the approval of the fire chief.

2	SUMMARY

	This bill permits municipal and volunteer firefighters to
б	use a flashing red light on personal vehicles while en route to or at the scene of a fire or other emergency. It also provides
8	that such vehicles are covered by the rules of operation applying to authorized emergency vehicles. The bill also adds
10	requirements that must be met before a person may use flashing lights on personal vehicles.
