Sec. 1. Rules. Resolved: That by January 1, 2004 the Department of Environmental Protection shall establish rules for dental offices and other places where mercury amalgam fillings are prepared, used, removed, replaced or repaired relative to the use of environmentally appropriate disposal equipment for amalgam waste to trap and dispose of mercury. Rules adopted pursuant to this resolve are major substantive rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

SUMMARY

This resolve requires the Department of Environmental Protection to adopt rules by January 1, 2004 for the proper disposal of mercury amalgam waste from dental offices and other places where mercury amalgam fillings are prepared, used, removed, replaced or repaired. The rules adopted are major substantive rules.
