An Act Concerning Full-time Law Enforcement and Corrections Officers

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2801-A, sub-§§3 and 4, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 521, \S and 17, are amended to read: 4 3. Full-time corrections officer. "Full-time corrections 6 officer" means a person who is employed as a corrections officer with a reasonable expectation of earning-at-least-\$10,000 working 8 at least 1,040 hours in any one calendar or fiscal year for 10 performing corrections officer duties. Full-time law enforcement officer. "Full-time 12 4. law enforcement officer" means a person who is employed as a law 14 enforcement officer with a reasonable expectation of earning-at least-\$10,000 working at least 1,040 hours in any one calendar or 16 fiscal year for performing law enforcement officer duties. 18 **SUMMARY** 20 This bill changes the method of determining who is a 22 full-time law enforcement or corrections officer for purposes of required training from one based on compensation to one based on 24 hours worked in the course of a year. This makes the training law consistent with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, 26 section 386, which deals with compensation of a deputy sheriff

based on hours worked.
