8	1. Prohibition. A person may not operate a motor vehicle while using a handheld cellular telephone.

12	2. Penalty. A person who violates this section commits a traffic infraction for which a fine of not less than \$50 for the first violation and not less than \$250 for a 2nd or subsequent
14	violation committed within one year of the first violation may be adjudged.

40	of authorized emergency vehicles, holders of commercial driver's licenses, public transit personnel, municipal public works
42	personnel, Maine Turnpike Authority personnel and state transportation personnel, including all employees and contractors
44	of the Department of Transportation, may use handheld cellulate telephones while driving within the scope of their employment
46	The bill makes the offense a traffic infraction.
