Committee Amendment "A" reduces the minimum allowable candlepower of lights on vehicles used for plowing snow on other than public ways from 1,000,000 to 50 candlepower and requires that those vehicles use such a light whenever the vehicle enters a public way while engaged in a plowing activity. This amendment specifies that a violation of this provision may result only in an oral warning from a law enforcement officer and specifically provides that a law enforcement officer may not issue a written warning or a traffic ticket to a person in violation of this provision.
