An Act to Require Flashing Lights for Private Snow Plows

2	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2054, sub-§2, ¶C, as amended by PL 2001, c.
4	360, §6, is further amended to read:
б	C. The use of amber lights on vehicles is governed by the following.
8	
10	(1) A vehicle engaged in highway maintenance or in emergency rescue operations by civil defense and public
12	safety agencies and a public utility emergency service vehicle may be equipped with auxiliary lights that emit an amber light.
14	
16	(2) A wrecker must be equipped with a flashing light mounted on top of the vehicle in such a manner as to emit an amber light over a 360° angle. The light must
18	be in use on a public way or a place where public traffic may reasonably be anticipated when servicing,
20	freeing, loading, unloading or towing a vehicle.
22	(3) A vehicle engaged in snow removal or sanding operations on a public way must be equipped with and
24	display at least 2 auxiliary lights mounted on the highest practical point on the vehicle and provide
26	visible light coverage over a 360° range. The lights must emit an amber beam of light, be at least 6 inches
28	in diameter and be equipped with blinking attachments. In lieu of the lights specified, a vehicle may be
30	equipped with at least one auxiliary rotating flashing light having 4-inch sealed beams and showing amber
32	beams of light over a 360° range or an amber strobe, or combination of strobes, that emits at a minimum a beam
34	of 1,000,000 candlepower and provides visible light coverage over a 360° range. When the left wing of a
36	plow is in operation and extends over the center of the road, an auxiliary light must show the extreme end of
38	the left wing. That light may be attached to the vehicle so that the beam of light points at the left
40	wing. The light illuminating the left wing may be controlled by a separate switch or by the regular
42	lighting system and must be in operation at all times when the vehicle is used for plowing snow on public
44	when the vehicle is used for prowing show on public ways.
46	(4) A vehicle equipped and used for plowing snow on other than public ways may must be equipped with an
48	auxiliary rotary flashing light that must be mounted on top of the vehicle in such a manner as to emit an amber
50	beam of light over a 360° angle, or an amber strobe, or

2	combination of strobes, that emits at a minimum a beam of 1,000,000 candlepower and provides visible light
4	coverage over a 360° range. The light may be in use on a public way only when the vehicle is entering the
б	public way in the course of plowing private driveways and other off-highway locations.
8	(5) A rural mail vehicle may be equipped with auxiliary lights.
10	
12	(a) The lights used to the front must be white or amber, or any shade between white and amber.
14	(b) The lights used to the rear must be amber or red, or any shade between amber and red.
16	
18	(c) The lights, whether used to the front or rear, must be mounted at the same level and as widely spaced laterally as possible.
20	
22	(d) The lights, whether used to the front or rear, must flash simultaneously.
24	(e) The lights must be visible from a distance of at least 500 feet under normal atmospheric
26	conditions at night.
28	(6) A vehicle used or provided by a contract security company to assist in traffic control and direction at
30	construction or maintenance sites on a public way may be equipped with auxiliary lights. Effective July 1,
32	1996, the auxiliary lights must be amber. Prior to July 1, 1996, the auxiliary lights must be green or
34	amber.
36	(7) A Department of Public Safety vehicle operated by a motor carrier inspector may be equipped with
38	auxiliary lights that emit an amber light.
40	SUMMARY

44	This bill requires vehicles used for plowing snow on private ways to be equipped with a rotary amber flashing light.
