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	There is established the Health Care Workforce Center,

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	This bill establishes the Health Care Workforce Center to
32	provide an ongoing strategy for the allocation of the State's
	resources to the health care workforce in this State. The center
34	will develop a strategic plan, convene groups of interested
	parties to recommend systemic changes and enhance and promote
36	recruitment, recognition and retention of the health care
	workforce. The center will be directed by an 8-member board.

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
