The county commissioners shall direct the 10 county clerk to call an organizational meeting of the budget committee no later than 60 days before the end of the county's 12 fiscal year. The county commissioners shall provide the committee with necessary clerical assistance, office expenses and 14 suitable meeting space, as well as access to county files and information. The budget committee shall adopt its own rules or 16 procedures and bylaws. 18 §884-B. Budget procedures 20 1. Proposed budget. The county commissioners shall submit an itemized budget estimate, as described in sections 701 and 22 702, to the budget committee in a timely fashion, no later than 60 days before the end of the county's fiscal year. 24 2. Budget review process. The budget committee shall 26 review the proposed itemized budget prepared by the county commissioners, together with any supplementary material prepared 28 by the head of each county department or provided by any independent board or institution or another governmental agency. 30 The budget committee may increase, decrease, alter or revise the proposed budget, if: 32 The budget committee enters into its minutes an 34 explanation for any change in the estimated expenditures and revenues as initially presented by the county commissioners; 36 and B. The budget committee shall hold a public hearing at least once in each of the 3 commissioner districts on the proposed budget before the end of the county's 44

fiscal year and before the final adoption of the budget. Notice

of the hearing must be given at least 10 days before the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation within the county. Written notice and a copy of the proposed budget must be sent by

registered or certified mail with return receipt requested, or

delivered in person, with proof received of the delivery, to the

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clerk of each municipality in the county. The municipal clerk shall notify the municipal officers of the proposed budget.

- 4. Adoption of budget. After the public hearings are completed, the budget committee may further increase, decrease, alter and revise the proposed itemized budget, subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed in subsection 2. The proposed itemized budget must be finally adopted by a majority vote of the budget committee at a duly called meeting not later than the end of the county's fiscal year. The approved budget is the final authorization for the assessment of county taxes. The budget must be sent to the county commissioners and the county tax authorized must be apportioned and collected in accordance with section 706.
- 5. Interim budget. If the budget is not approved before the start of a fiscal year, until a budget is finally adopted, the county shall operate on an interim budget that may not exceed the previous year's budget.
- 6. Transfer of funds. The county commissioners may transfer funds as provided in section 922.

#### §884-C. Budget amendments

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The approved budget must govern the expenditures of the 26 county during the fiscal year. Expenses may not be incurred in 28 excess of those shown in the approved budget, but the budget may be revised from time to time by the preparation and submission of 30 a proposed amended budget by the county commissioners to the budget committee. The budget committee shall render, not less 32 than 15 calendar days, except in emergencies, nor more than 30 days after the submission to it, a decision on any such revised 34 budget. An approved revised budget must be transmitted to the State Auditor within 15 days of the budget committee's action. 36

Sec. 7. 30-A MRSA §885, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 513, is amended to read:

#### §885. Final budget; filing

- A copy of the final budget estimates <u>and subsequent</u> <u>amendments</u> must be filed, on forms approved by the Department of Audit, with the State Auditor, who shall retain them for 3 years.
- Sec. 8. Continuation of service. Any member of the Sagadahoc County Budget Advisory Committee on the effective date of this Act continues to serve on the Sagadahoc County Budget Committee for the remainder of the term to which the member was elected.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill amends the procedures for adopting a budget for Sagadahoc County. Under current law, the county commissioners submit a budget estimate to an advisory committee that makes recommendations back to the commissioners; but the budget is adopted by a majority vote of the county commissioners. Under the bill, the county commissioners will submit a budget estimate to a budget committee that will conduct at least one public hearing in each of the 3 commissioner districts and the budget committee is responsible for final adoption of the county budget and any later amendments to it. The bill retains the same make up of the advisory committee for the budget committee; that is, from each commissioner district, 2 elected municipal officials and one public member. The bill provides that members currently serving on the advisory committee will serve on the budget committee until the terms for which they were elected expire.
