An Act to Establish the Avon-Phillips Airport Authority

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4	Sec. 1. Avon-Phillips Airport Authority established. The
4	Avon-Phillips Airport Authority is established as a body corporate and politic and a public instrumentality of the State
6	to carry out the provisions of this Act and shall take title to, acquire and manage the properties within the geographical
8	boundaries of the Avon-Phillips Airport and other properties as
10	may be authorized by law in the name of the State. As used in this Act, "authority" means the Avon-Phillips Airport Authority.
12	1. Powers. The authority may:
14	A. Sue and be sued;
16	B. Adopt bylaws consistent with this Act for the governance of its affairs;
18 20	C. Exercise all of the general powers of corporations under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 13-C, section 302;

22	D. Acquire real and personal property for use by the authority;
24	E. Exercise the power of eminent domain;
26	F. Lease, rent or otherwise dispose of real or personal
28	property;
30	G. Provide for the public safety by imposing appropriate regulations, regulating appropriate use of the airport
32	facilities and enforcing laws and regulations as they apply to the use of the airport's facilities;
34	H. Charge and collect fees, charges and rents for the use
36	of the properties and other services and use the proceeds of those fees, charges and rents for the purposes provided in
38	this Act;
40	I. Provide from operating revenues for the maintenance, construction or reconstruction of facilities for which the
42	authority has not otherwise provided to ensure the public safety;

46	J. Take all other lawful action necessary and incidental to these powers; and
48	K. Adopt rules pursuant to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act. Any such rules are routine technical rules

as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

Board of trustees. The authority is governed by a board of trustees composed of 7 voting members appointed by the county
 commissioners of Franklin County.

A. Trustees are appointed for 4-year terms, except that, for initial appointments, 2 trustees are appointed to
one-year terms, 2 trustees are appointed to 2-year terms, 2 trustees are appointed to 3-year terms and one trustee is
appointed to a 4-year term. Two trustees must reside in the Town of Avon and 2 trustees must reside in the Town of Phillips.

B. A trustee continues to hold office until a successor is appointed and qualified, but the term of the successor is not altered from the original expiration date of the holdover trustee's term. A person may not serve more than 3 consecutive 4-year terms as a trustee.

22 C. A quorum, which is a majority of members, is required for the board of trustees to take action.

D. The trustees shall elect a chair and vice-chair from among the members of the board of trustees. The authority may employ an executive director, technical experts and other agents and employees, permanent and temporary, that it requires and may determine their qualifications, duties and compensation.

 32 E. A trustee is not entitled to receive compensation for services to the authority but is entitled to receive
 34 reimbursement for necessary expenditures, including travel expenses, incurred in carrying out those services.

36 3. Liability. The liability of the authority is governed by the Maine Tort Claims Act. A member of the board of trustees 38 of the authority or an employee of the authority may not be subject to any personal liability for having acted within the 40 course and scope of membership or employment to carry out a power 42 or duty under this Act. The authority shall indemnify a member of the authority or an employee of the authority against expenses 44 actually and necessarily incurred in connection with the defense of an action or proceeding in which the member or employee is 46 made a party by reason of past or present association with the authority.

SUMMARY

This bill establishes the Avon-Phillips Airport Authority, governed by a board of 7 trustees, of which 2 trustees must be residents of the Town of Avon and 2 trustees must be residents of the Town of Phillips. The authority may adopt bylaws for the governance of its affairs, acquire real and personal property, lease, rent or otherwise dispose of real or personal property and exercise the power of eminent domain.
