Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 2 as emergencies; and 4 Whereas, social worker licensure has undergone change in the 6 last few years and requires further amendment prior to July 1, 2003 in order to provide the public with information about 8 professional qualifications; and 10 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 12 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 14 safety; now, therefore, 16 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: PART A 18 Sec. 44	SUMMARY
46	This bill creates a new category of licensure, a licensed human service provider, under a renamed State Board of Social Worker and Human Service Provider Licensure. The bill makes
48	necessary changes in social work licensure to accommodate the new category of licensure. It updates other laws, correcting

cross-references and making the new licensed human service
2 providers mandatory reporters of child and adult abuse.
