must be placed at the end of the waiting list for the lobster fishing zone and behind any person currently in the apprentice program.

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2. It amends the membership of the Lobster License Appeal Committee established in Committee Amendment "A" to allow former Legislators who were members of the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources matters to be members of the Lobster License Appeal Committee.

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3. It establishes the procedure that must be followed by a person appealing to the Lobster License Appeal Committee and by the committee, including the meeting dates, notice to the appellant and the standard of proof that must be met by the appellant.

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4. It requires the Commissioner of Marine Resources to make a final determination regarding the recommendation of the Lobster License Appeal Committee within 72 hours of notice of the decision of the committee.

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5. It specifies that meetings of the Lobster License Appeal Committee are not public meetings.
