24	Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 2 by striking out all of the last underlined sentence (page 1, lines 11 to 16 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following: ' <u>The bureau may</u>				
26	not grant a permit to, or enter into a contract with, an				
28	<u>individual who is not a United States citizen for the cutting,</u> <u>skidding or hauling of timber on or from nonreserved lands. If</u> <u>the bureau grants a permit or enters into a contract with a</u>				
30	corporation or other legal entity to cut timber on nonreserved land, that permit or contract must include a provision				
32	prohibiting any person who is not a United States citizen from cutting, skidding or hauling timber on or from nonreserved public				
34	lands.'

Fiscal Detail and Notes

Not allowing the Department of Conservation to contract with certain workers for timber harvesting will result in the estimated loss of Other Special Revenue funds in the amounts of at least \$168,750 and \$225,000 in fiscal years 2003-04 and 2004-05, respectfully. If the department is not successful in hiring additional timber cutting crews that are composed of U.S. citizens, then the revenue loss could be significantly more; the amounts can not be determined at this time.
