2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1302, sub-§3** is enacted to read:

6 **3. Waiting period for failure to pass road test.** A minor
8 who fails to pass a road test shall wait at least 30 days before
10 being reexamined and shall complete 5 additional hours of driving
12 while accompanied by a parent, guardian or licensed driver who is
14 at least 20 years of age.

12 **SUMMARY**

14 This bill requires a waiting period of 30 days and the
16 completion of 5 additional hours of supervised driving before a
person under 18 years of age may retake a road test.
