18	§12582. Tuition waiver
20	Any person who meets the requirements of subsection 1 may
	audit courses in accordance with established institutional audit
22	policy at any state postsecondary educational institution free of
24	tuition charges, as provided in this section.
27	1. Eligibility. A person is eligible for a tuition waiver
26	under this chapter if the person is:
28	A. A Maine resident; and
30	B. Sixty-five years of age or older. A person is eligible
	at any time during the calendar year of that person's 65th
32	birthday, regardless of the actual date during that calendar

34	2. Limitation. The tuition waiyer provided by this chapter
36	is limited to courses where space is available.
38	3. Continuation. The tuition waiver provided by this
	chapter is awarded on a yearly basis and continues to be
40	available, if the person is otherwise eligible under this section, as long as the person remains in compliance with the

	4. Revenue reduction. A state postsecondary educational
46	institution shall absorb the reduction in tuition revenues that results from providing a tuition waiver to an eligible person
48	under this chapter. The institution may not request additional General Fund appropriations from the Legislature to offset the
50	reduction in tuition revenues.

<u>§12583. Administration</u>

 Application. A person desiring a tuition waiver under
this chapter may apply to the state postsecondary educational institution for determination of eligibility. Application must
be on forms and in a manner prescribed by the institution.

8 2. Decision. A state postsecondary educational institution
shall determine whether an applicant is eligible for a tuition
10 waiver under this chapter and notify the applicant.

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SUMMARY

This bill allows residents 65 years of age and older to audit courses at any state postsecondary educational institution free of tuition charges. Individuals are allowed to audit only if space is available, as tuition-paying students have priority in the case of limited class size.
