30	Current law requires specified persons to report to the
38	Department of Human Services when they know or have reasonable cause to suspect that a child has been or is likely to be abused
40	or neglected. Current law also requires specified persons to
4.2	report to the Department of Human Services when they suspect that
42	an adult has been abused, neglected or exploited and the person has reasonable cause to suspect the adult is incapacitated or
44	dependent. This bill amends both those laws to require officials
46	of a church or other religious institution or association to report the suspected abuse, neglect or exploitation.
48	Current law requires clergy to report known or suspected
50	child abuse or neglect. This bill adds clergy to the list of mandated reporters of adult abuse, neglect or exploitation.
