COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "B" to H.P. 268, L.D. 339

C. Before provisionally adopting the rules, the board must
demonstrate by successful testing that applicable application programming interfaces and standards function to
the satisfaction of the parties described in paragraph A.

6 Sec. 2. Costs of adopting rule and implementing electronic filing. The Workers' Compensation Board shall implement this Act within 8 existing resources.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill and is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor. It provides that all 14 rules to require electronic filing of information are major substantive rules and must be brought to the Legislature for 16 review before being finally adopted. It also requires the 18 Workers' Compensation Board to use the consensus-based rule development process described in the Maine Administrative 20 Procedure Act to develop the rules and specifies certain additional requirements. It also provides that the Workers' Compensation Board shall implement the provision within existing 22 resources. 24
