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	2. Programs. The commission shall develop and, to the
30	extent of available funds, implement conservation programs in accordance with this section. The commission shall establish
32	and, on a schedule determined by the commission, revise
34	objectives and an overall energy strategy for conservation programs. Conservation programs implemented by the commission
24	must be consistent with the objectives and an overall energy
36	strategy developed by the commission and be cost effective, as
	defined by the commission by rule or order. In defining "cost
38	effective," the commission may consider the extent to which a program promotes sustainable economic development or reduces
40	environmental damage to the extent the commission can quantify or

Sec. 2. Report. The Public Utilities Commission shalf 6 undertake an investigation to identify rate designs, mechanisms or other means that provide incentives for transmission and 8 distribution utilities to promote energy efficiency and that promote the security and robustness of the electric grid by 10 appropriately compensating transmission and distribution utilities for constructing maintaining and additional infrastructure that the commission determines necessary to ensure 12 the security and robustness of the grid in underserved areas of 14 the State. In conducting its investigation, in addition to any other issues the commission determines appropriate, the commission shall consider: 16

 Rate design mechanisms that encourage efficiency in electric use, provide incentives for the development of new
 energy-efficient business activity in the State and take into account the costs and benefits of energy efficiency and
 conservation to existing business activity in the State;

24 2. Financial and other incentives for transmission and distribution utilities or their customers that may support the
 26 goals of this section;

3. The impact of achieving the goals of this section on the revenues and rates of return of transmission and distribution
 utilities;

32 4. Methods available pursuant to the Maine Revised
Statutes, Title 35-A, sections 3195 and 3211-A to accomplish the
34 purposes of this section;

36 5. The impact of achieving the goals of this section on transmission and distribution utility rate levels and rate 38 stability; and

40 6. The impact of electricity generation and consumption on air and water quality.

By February 1, 2004, the commission shall submit a report of the results of its investigation under this section to the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities and Energy.'

SUMMARY

As in the bill, requires the Public Utilities Commission an investigation to undertake identify rate designs, to 12 mechanisms or other means that provide incentives for transmission and distribution utilities to promote energy efficiency and that promote the security and robustness of the 14 electric grid.
