## **SUMMARY**

This amendment replaces the resolve. The amendment designates the State Vietnam Veterans' Memorial located in Capitol Park in Augusta, which was constructed in 1985 and funded in part by a \$10,000 appropriation by the Legislature, as the official state memorial to honor the veterans of Maine who gave their lives in defense of freedom during the Vietnam War.

The amendment further recognizes that, notwithstanding the designation of the State Vietnam Veterans' Memorial in Capitol Park as the official state memorial in honor of Vietnam War veterans, the Legislature may from time to time designate other monuments, structures or property in other locations throughout the State as state memorials in honor of those veterans.

The amendment also designates a monument to be erected in Bangor on the grounds of the Cole Land Transportation Museum as a state memorial to honor the veterans of Maine who gave their lives during the Vietnam War and those veterans of the Vietnam War who are still missing in action.
