## An Act To Require All Fees, Fines and Penalties To Be Deposited into the General Fund

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §131, as amended by PL 1989, c. 501, Pt. P, §7 4 and PL 1995, c. 502, Pt. E, §30, is further amended to read:

#### 6 §131. Departmental collections

8 Every department and agency of the State, whether located at the Capitol or not, collecting or receiving public money, or money from any source whatsoever, belonging to or for the use of 10 the State, or for the use of any state department or agency, 12 shall pay the same immediately into the State Treasury, without any deductions on account of salaries, fees, costs, charges, 14refunds, claims or demands expenses, of any description whatsoever. The Bureau of Parks and Lands shall-be-allowed-to 16 may refund daily use and camping fees based on the Bureau of Parks and Lands standard refund policies. Any department or agency may shall deposit such money to the credit of the State 18 upon communicating with the Treasurer of State and receiving from 20 the Treasurer of State instructions as to what state depository may be used for that purpose and in every such case, the 22 depositor shall send to the Treasurer of State a statement of the deposits certified by the bank receiving it them. Beginning 24 October 1, 2003, notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Treasurer of State shall deposit into the General Fund all public 26 money received as fines, forfeitures, fees and penalties imposed and collected by every department and agency of the State. This 28 section shall does not apply to county or town officers.

Sec. 2. Statutory revisions. The Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services shall prepare legislation that amends the
Maine Revised Statutes to reflect the intent of this Act. The commissioner shall submit this legislation to the Second Regular
Session of the 121st Legislature no later than November 1, 2003.

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#### **SUMMARY**

This bill requires, beginning October 1, 2003, all fines, 40 forfeitures, fees and penalties collected by a department or agency of the State to be deposited into the General Fund. This 42 bill requires the Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services to submit legislation that amends the Maine Revised 44 Statutes to change any provisions of current law to effectuate 44 the intent of this bill.
