An Act To Increase the Compensation of Jurors

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 14 MRSA §1215, as amended by PL 1991, c. 591, Pt. E,
4	\$13, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
6	§1215. Mileage and compensation of jurors
8	A juror is entitled to paid mileage at the rate of 32¢ per mile for travel expenses from the juror's residence to the place
10	of holding court and return and to compensation for each day of required attendance at sessions of the court in the following
12	amount:
14	1. Rate until July 1, 2004. Prior to July 1, 2004, \$10;
16	2. Rate beginning July 1, 2004 and ending June 30, 2005. Beginning July 1, 2004 and ending June 30, 2005, \$25;
18	3. Rate beginning July 1, 2005 and ending June 30, 2006.
20	Beginning July 1, 2005 and ending June 30, 2006, \$40; and
22	4. Rate beginning July 1, 2006. Beginning July 1, 2006, \$55.
24	Sec. 2. Payment of jurors. Compensation provided to jurors
26	pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 14, section 1215 must be paid for through revenue raised from the levy of fees,
28	forfeitures, penalties and fines imposed pursuant to civil or criminal action, notwithstanding any other dedication of those
30	fees, forfeitures, penalties and fines. The State Court Administrator shall prepare legislation implementing this Act for
32	submission to the Second Regular Session of the 121st Legislature no later than December 1, 2003.

36	SUMMARY
38	This bill increases the mileage paid to jurors from 15¢ to 32¢ per mile. This bill also increases the per diem paid to
40	jurors from \$10 to \$55 over a 2-year period beginning July 1, 2004. This bill also requires that payment for jurors come from
42	fines, forfeitures, penalties and fees levied pursuant to a criminal or civil action and requires the State Court
44	Administrator to submit legislation implementing this payment requirement.
