Resolve, To Study the Policies of the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Revenue Services Regarding Tax Collection Practices

- Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Policies of the Bureau of Revenue Services Regarding 2 Tax Collection, referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established; and be it further Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 12 members: 8 Three members from the Senate, appointed by 10 President of the Senate: 12 2. Three members from the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House; 14 3. Four members who are tax professionals employed in the private sector, appointed jointly by the President of the Senate 16 and the Speaker of the House; and 18 Two members of the public, appointed jointly by the 20 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House; and be it further 2.2 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member 24 is the Senate chair of the commission and the first-named House member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further; 26 Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission; meetings. 28 Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by all 30 appointing authorities once the selections have been made. chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting 32 of the commission no later than 15 days after all appointments are made; and be it further 34 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study the 36 policies and approaches of the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Revenue Services regarding tax 38 collection practices, review and evaluate the responsibilities of the taxpayer advocate, and assess the need for a tax ombudsman; 40 and be it further 42 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis
 - Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive

shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and

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be it further

legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes. Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Other members of the commission who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over taxation matters and the Legislative Council by January 2, 2004. The commission is authorized to introduce legislation related to its report to the First Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature at the time of the submission of its report; and be it further

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- Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further
- Sec. 10. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget.

Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council or the executive director's designee shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.
