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Sec. 3. 30-A MRSA §405, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 594, §1, is amended to read: ſ

2. Liability. When a county sheriff or deputy sheriff makes an arrest, as authorized in subsection 1 1-A, outside of 6 jurisdictional limits of the county in which the sheriff or 8 deputy sheriff is appointed, that sheriff or deputy sheriff has the same immunity from tort liability and all of the pension, 10 relief, disability, worker's compensation, insurance and any other benefits the sheriff or deputy sheriff enjoys while performing duties within the 12 sheriff or deputy sheriff's appointing county.

Sec. 4. 30-A MRSA §2671, sub-§2-A, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 594, §2, is amended to read:

18 Optional powers. 2-A. Sec. 5. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §8-A, first ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL 1991, c. 548, Pt. A, §36, is amended to read:

The trustees of the University of Maine System, or such 10 administrators of the University of Maine System as the trustees may designate for this purpose, may appoint persons to act as police officers who, within the limits of the property owned by 12 or under the control of the University of Maine System, possess 14 all of the powers of police officers in criminal cases and civil violations. The trustees of the University of Maine System may authorize the University of Maine System's full-time police 16 officers who have met the requirements of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 25, section 2804-C to perform any of the acts 18 described in Title 17-A. section 15 while outside the limits of the property owned by or under control of the University of Maine 20 System if, when possible, the law enforcement agency of a foreign 22 municipality in which the arrest is to be made is notified in advance or, when not possible, the law enforcement agency of the foreign municipality in which the arrest has been made is 24 notified immediately after the arrest. When a University of Maine System police officer makes an arrest outside the limits of 26 the property owned by or under control of the University of Maine System as authorized in this section, that police officer has the 28 same immunity from tort liability and all of the pension, relief, 30 disability, workers' compensation, insurance and any other benefits the police officer enjoys while performing duties within the limits of the property owned by or under control of the 32 University of Maine System.'

SUMMARY

38 This amendment replaces the bill. The amendment:

40 1. Retains the authority of counties and municipalities to their officers empowered determine whether are to make out-of-county or out-of-municipality arrests; 42

44 Limits who may exercise these powers to only those 2. officers who meet the training requirements of the Maine Revised 46 Statutes, Title 25, section 2804-C;

Expands these arrest powers for officers who meet the 48 3. training requirements to include all powers listed in Title 17-A, section 15; 50

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 Retains liability protection for officers with these arrest powers under the county or municipality of their appointment;

Retains the duty of these officers to notify the county or municipality in which they are making the arrest that the
 arrest will be or has been made; and

 Authorizes the trustees of the University of Maine System to empower the university system's full-time police
 officers to make arrests described in Title 17-A, section 15 outside university property, subject to the same training
 requirements, liability protection and notification requirements governing counties and municipalities for this purpose.

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
